Take a look at some of Lucy's work as Telford's MP: standing up for our community and championing the needs and concerns of local people

Lucy has secured £25m funding for Telford to help get our ecomony back on track.

After lobbying ministers for further investment into our area and bringing the Secretary of State for Local Government to Telford to hear resident concerns, Lucy has won a £25 million New Towns Deal. She is working with local partners on the Telford Town's Fund Board, to make recommendations on how this money should best be spent. Lucy would like to see it used to help create new economy jobs, boost connectivity and improve local transport connections.

Lucy fights for Telford's 24-hour A&E and Women & Children's Centre

In November 2019 Lucy successfully crowd-funded for legal advice to help save Telford's A&E and Women & Children Services.

This was the latest step in the long running campaign Lucy has been running to keep Telford's hospital care close to home. The Trust acknowledges that the 'Shrewsbury option' is unsatisfactory. The outcome of this fight is still uncertain but, after years of working to save the Princess Royal, we still have these services in our town and Lucy will carry on the fight.

In December 2019, Lucy was re-elected as Telford's MP with the largest vote share in Telford's history.

During the 2019 General Election, Lucy won nearly 60% of the total votes cast and a majority of just under 11,000 votes: the greatest vote share of any Telford MP ever. Lucy wants to use this win and her third term as Telford's MP to make sure that Telford's voice is heard louder than ever - locally and in Parliament - and she has immediately set to work on doing just that.

The scale of avoidable maternity deaths and poor care at the Shrewsbury and Telford Hospital Trust has exposed major concerns about patient safety at Telford's Princess Royal Hospital.

Lucy took hospital management to task over these failings, met with victims and relatives, called a debate and urgent question of ministers in Parliament to ensure action was taken and worked to support the Ockenden Inquiry, which is seeking to expose the truth and hold to account those responsible.

Flooding has long affected residents, business and livelihoods in Ironbridge and the surrounding areas. The Government must proactively tackle the threat posed by the rising of the River Severn.

Earlier this year, £5.2 billion pounds was allocated to flood defences, river management and direct support for communities at risk. Lucy has worked cross party in Government to secure greater flood support, and is pleased that this new package will see at least £36 million allocated to the management of the River Severn.
